

Here is an amazing guide that will link you to all the laws, rules, cases, and websites that you'll need to know when fighting a NYC parking ticket.

1. NY Vehicle and Traffic Laws ("VTL")

Article 32 contains the laws passed by the NY State Legislature that cover stopping, standing, and parking throughout the State of NY. NYC is eligible for "Home Rule" so you gotta check the NYC Traffic Rules to find out which law covers your particular predicament.

3. NYC Parking Violation ~ Hearings

Chapter 39 of title 19 of the Official Compilation of Rules of the City of New York. Chapter 39 was adopted by the Commissioner of Finance to prescribe the internal procedures and organization of the Parking Violations Bureau, the manner and time of entering pleas, the conduct of hearings, the amount and manner of payment of penalties, and other purposes of article two-B of the Vehicle and Traffic Law.

4. NYC Administrative Code

Here is where the laws passed by the NYC Council live. If you check out any parking law, this is how it'll look:

"A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to removal of postings of temporary parking changes.

Be it enacted by the Council as follows:

Section 1. Section 19-175.2 of the administrative code of the city of New York is amended to add a new subdivision f to read as follows:

f. All postings of temporary parking restrictions required by this section or otherwise posted by the police department or any other agency shall be removed by the entity that placed such posting not more than twenty four hours following the conclusion of the temporary parking restrictions.

§2. This local law shall take effect immediately upon enactment."
